With your permission, I would request to place the FY2022 MMHCGP Application and Requested Budget on the agenda for June 3, 2021 Standing Committee Meeting for review and approval.

Funding for FY2022 will remain the same as the previous year in that it will be administered by the State Court Administrative Office. In addition, the Mental Health Court plans to continue its contract for treatment and services with St. Clair County Community Mental Health Authority.

The proposed budget for FY2022 has increased based on an expected rise in participants, drug testing, and mental health service costs. This year we have requested a grant award in the amount of \$385,802.00.

Due to the pandemic, we have seen an increase in referrals and the need for mental health assistance.

One of the biggest changes we have made in our program is reporting for review and plea hearings through ZOOM, either by video or phone. This is at times a challenge for the participants. Not all of them are able or have the technology to participate this way.

During the FY21, our court began working with the St. Clair County Public Defender's office. The defender's office is still in the beginning stages of operations and are doing their best to accommodate our courtroom schedules. At this time, they are not requesting any funds through our grant.

We are requesting \$385,802 for the FY2022 MMHCGP. It is \$48,141 more than we were awarded in FY2021. The increased funds requested are based on an expected rise in participants, drug testing, and mental health service costs.

During the pandemic, the court maintained services for all the open participants. The amount of new referrals declined during the second half of FY2020 due to District Court hearings being adjourned for court closures, hearings held via video only, defendants not being able to appear, and defense attorneys not able to connect with defendants. After the first half of FY2021, our new referrals increased considerably. We expect the referrals to continue to increase in FY2022.

In the second half of FY2020, our court-contracted drug testing facilities continued to provide testing services as much as possible, but were limited due to state closures. Many of our participants were quarantined and not able to drug test as ordered. The first half of FY2021, has been a slow process, but has already surpassed pre-pandemic data.

With the increase in participants comes an increase in mental health service needs. CMH has been serving more individuals in MHC who are underinsured or don't qualify for Medicaid. These services are being paid by CMH general fund dollars. The general fund portion is the portion not covered by Medicaid, Healthy Michigan, or other insurance providers. In the past fiscal years, CMH would adjust their general fund percentages to meet the contractual budgeted amount allowed. As an example, in FY2020 CMH could have invoiced 18.12% general funds billable to our grant, but reduced it to 10% to stay within the allowed budget.

In FY2020, we were not able to submit the full amount in our fourth quarter financial claim report due to insufficient funds in the grant (-\$2,302.20). This amount could have been more, except a majority of our county was either full or partially closed due to the pandemic for at least seven (7) months of the fiscal year. The closures reduced some of the operation costs for personnel/fringe, testing, and treatment services. Our court still used 100% of the funds awarded.

In FY2021, we expect to use 100% of the funds that were awarded (\$337,661). At this point, it is hard to determine if more funds will be needed before the end of the fiscal year.

Staff is being charged to the grant in order to maintain operations of the program. While the county can support some of the personnel costs, they cannot assume all personnel costs. Without grant funds, downsizing would occur in both personnel and in the program operations.

In addition, the prosecutor has access to additional information that can affect a defendant's eligibility for the MHC program. In the past, individuals have been included in the MHC who likely would not have been because of information that only the prosecutor was aware of or the willingness

Attached is the application for the 2021 Bullet Proof Vest Partnership Program.

The Sheriff's Office Road Patrol is requesting to apply for the 2021 Bullet Proof Vest Partnership Program. Applications are due on June 14, 2021.

They would like to purchase 22 vests with the 2021 funds.

The approximate cost of one vest is \$525. The Bullet Proof Vest Partnership Program will pay for 50% of the cost of the vests. They are requesting \$5,775.00 from the BVP Program and the remaining 50% of the cost would be paid out of the respective departments' budgets.

In 2020, the County received \$725.41 in grants funds.
