RESOLUTION TO REQUEST FUNDS FOR
COVID RELIEF PROGRAM

B. Ringer moved the adoption of the following resolution:

WHEREAS, The Saint Clair County Board of Commissioners has informed Columbus Township that COVID relief money in the amount of approximately \$2000 per Township resident has been made available

WHEREAS, The County Board of Commissioners has desired to know how the relief money will be spent prior to approval,

WEREAS, The Columbus Township Board has determined that the Palms Rd. culvert 40 ft. x 73 in. x 55 in. arch 120 ft. north of Rattle Run Rd. be replaced when funds are available. The total cost of the project is estimated to be approximately \$55,000.00 and,

WEREAS, The Columbus Township Board has determined that the Frith Rd. culvert over the Dawson Drain be replaced when funds are available. The total cost of the project is estimated to be approximately \$60,000.00 and,

WEARAS, Any leftover money will be spent on other ditching projects,

WHEREAS, the total funds will not be committed prior to the 2022 fiscal year.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That Columbus Township request the Board of County Commissioners of the County of St. Clair approve Columbus Township's participation in the COVID relief program outlined by Commissioner Rushing.
